- Something accomplished in conjunction with an outside club, activity or organization (*ex: Boy/Girl Scouts, service clubs, dance teams*)
- Something accomplished in conjunction with a student’s family, neighborhood, or community (*ex: helped someone in need; organized a neighborhood event; volunteered at RCC to help with Martin Luther King Day celebration*)
- Participation in an event devoted to raising money or awareness for a cause (*ex: Walked in Relay for life, raised money for hurricane relief*)
